One bill. Four historic wins.

1. Delivers true universal school choice for every Texas family
Money follows the child — public, private, charter, homeschool, or micro-schooling. No zip code traps. No income caps. No lotteries or red tape.
Higher Education Freedom Accounts (~\$12,000+ base, more for special needs) from Day 1.
2. Fully funds schools and cuts property taxes — zero new taxes, zero cuts
The *Freedom Fund* delivers billions in new revenue from the **Cultivate Texas Act** (responsible, regulated cannabis the Texas way) and **Texas Freedom Act** (unleashing safe free enterprise like coastal resorts).
Boosts per-student funding for public schools. Raises teacher pay where deserved.
Gives parents real options while delivering the biggest property tax relief in Texas history — phased in as revenues ramp up, starting with surpluses.
3. Right now — in January 2026 — Texas families are still trapped
Abbott's new ESA program opens applications this month, but it's capped, prioritized, and limited — wealthier families wait years, potential lotteries if demand exceeds the weak initial funding, and bureaucracy slows everything down.
Public schools remain underfunded— no basic allotment increase worth mentioning since 2019— while illegal immigration strains classrooms, draining billions that should go to American kids.
Harmful agendas and indecent curricula creep into some districts.
Girls' sports and privacy under attack.
Parents beg for options, but Austin gives half-measures while open borders profit.
Texas kids get shortchanged. Texas taxpayers get the bill.
4. Puts parents and Texas kids back in control
Ends the zip code monopoly. Empowers families with real choice.
Bans harmful agendas, protects girls' sports and privacy, strengthens homeschool freedoms.
Prioritizes resources for American families first— audits strains, demands federal fixes.
Lets faith-based and traditional schools thrive without government overreach.
